 The words to hymn 519, *Make Me A Channel of Your Peace*, are attributed to St. Francis of Assisi (13th century). The hymn is an anthem of the [Royal British Legion](#) and is usually sung every year at the Service of Remembrance in November at the [Royal Albert Hall](#). Also the Missionaries of Charity, the religious order started by Mother Teresa, begin each day by reciting this prayer.
 The melody for this hymn was written by Sebastian Temple (1928-), a South African composer who became a secular Franciscan. His music for worship has been recorded in six separate collections.
